The cold-pressing process, which extracts the juice from fruit and vegetables, has been proven to preserve the nutritional value of the raw fruit more effectively than other methods making it the healthier choice.

A completely natural phenomenon that occurs during the high pressure cold-pressing process, it is the polyphenols, reacting with the light that gives Cocoloco's coconut water its beautiful pink hue.

Furthermore, the company is able to trace the origin of each and every one of the fruits it uses by working with only nam hom coconuts, particularly famous for their lightly sweet and tropical fragrance, from a single region in Thailand.
