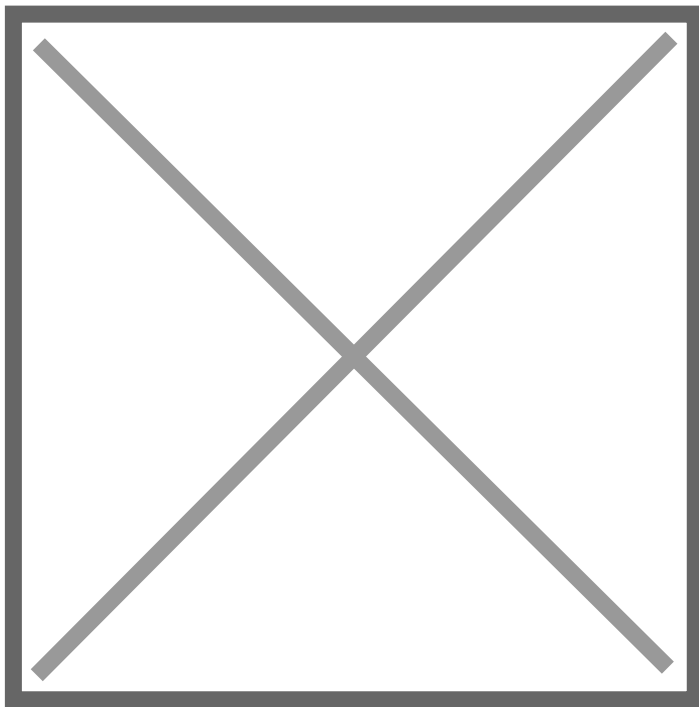


dsm-firmenich and United Nations World Food Programme expand partnership
